So, in the family “ $\Omega\bar{\alpha}\hat{\zeta}\phi\hat{\zeta}\eta\hat{\zeta}$ ” (Raefene), with parents “ $\Psi\bar{\alpha}\mu\kappa\hat{\zeta}\lambda$ ” (Samwel) and “ $\Theta\bar{\alpha}\eta\bar{\alpha}\eta$ ” (Hanan), and they had a child and named them “ $\overline{\omega}\hat{\zeta}\eta\delta\eta\hat{\zeta}$ ” (Aerone); Their full name would be “ $\overline{\omega}\hat{\zeta}\eta\delta\eta\hat{\zeta}_ \Psi\bar{\alpha}\mu\kappa\hat{\zeta}\lambda_ \Theta\bar{\alpha}\eta\bar{\alpha}\eta_ \Omega\bar{\alpha}\hat{\zeta}\phi\hat{\zeta}\eta\hat{\zeta}$ ”.
